


About






Objectives

To provide students with the platform to hone their artistic skills and push the boundaries of their creativity for a social good.






To ensure students are able to use art to convey messages, tell stories, and explore themes that resonate with them on online safety and their community, fostering dialogue, empathy, and understanding.


